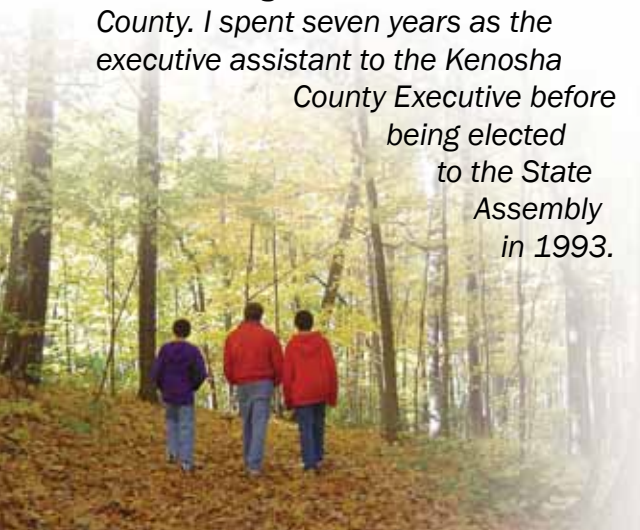
Now I am excited by the prospect of returning to county government as Kenosha County Executive where many of the programs I have fought for at the state level are actually implemented.



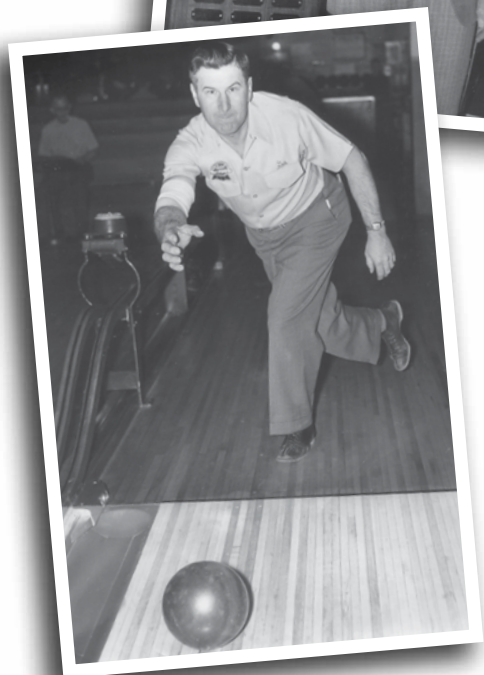
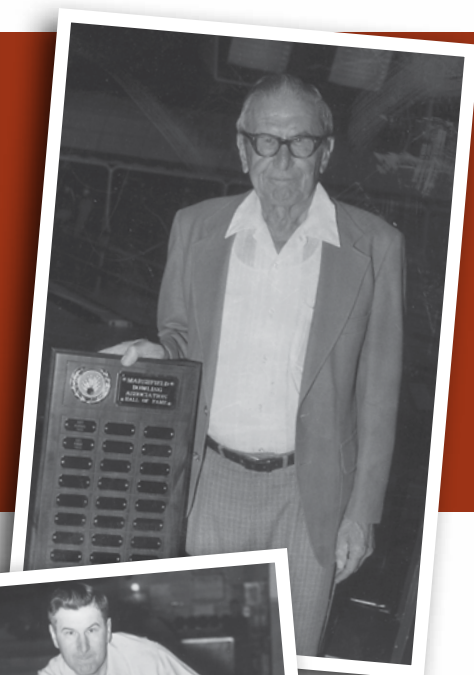
